Principal's Message

Del Sur is proud of our distinctive programs provided for students in TK through 8th grade. Our college prep initiative known as AVID, Advancement Via Individual Determination is one of the most prominent programs that supports our career and college goals on campus. The college and career readiness goals we have focused on this year are specifically in the areas of writing and creating specific SMART goals that are self-monitored for progress, which aids in gaining confidence and independence. We are committed to maintaining a safe campus where students are supported academically, socially, and emotionally. We continue to integrate and develop Project Lead the Way Curriculum and STEM based projects throughout the school year. We also offer interventions such as IXL learning and tutoring opportunities during the school day. We believe every child entrusted to our care must be provided with quality instruction. This years' SPARC is directly tied to our Local Control Accountability Plan and Single Plan for Student Achievement goals, providing student achievement and maintaining a safe campus climate. Del Sur School earned WASC (Western Association of School and Colleges) accreditation in 2019, making it one of the few K-8 schools in California with this credential.


Career and College Readiness Student Outcomes

The Student Support Team (SST) is guided by the ASCA Mindsets and Behaviors for student success and K-12 college-and-career-readiness standards. We use student outcomes to measure the effectiveness of programs for continuous improvement. The following graphs illustrate the number of students who completed a post-secondary options lesson and illustrates knowledge gained. Also reflecting the importance of time management in the post secondary setting.

Career Readiness

SST members at Del Sur along with teachers provide projects on career research including career requirements and education. This year Del Sur 8th grade students were given a lesson on post-secondary options in which they learned about the different college systems, the eligibility requirements of each, as well as the purpose and benefits of trade or technical schools. The graph to the right shows 121 8th grade students gained basic postsecondary knowledge regarding California college options and technical/trade schools. Based on pre/post testing, 75.4% of the students were able to describe the benefits of technical and trade school, 67.8% can describe California's college options, and 40.9% demonstrated knowledge of the A-G requirements.


Postsecondary Goal can be Clearly Described



College Readiness

The Del Sur SST members takes pride in the efforts of our student's achievements and acknowledges their significant importance to college readiness. Del Sur recognizes time management as an essential college ready skill. To develop time management skills and promote daily practice, two - hundred and forty-five, 4th - 6th grade students were given a Time Management lesson. Demonstrating the principals and advantages using key functions for positive outcomes. Post assessment displayed an 26.9% growth in understanding the necessity to create a TO-DO-List, 11.16% growth in recognizing the benefit of being prepared and 30.02% growth in understanding the term, "Eat the Frog" (doing the worst task first).

21st Century Skills

The Del Sur SST coordinates and monitors several programs that foster "21st" Century Skills within our students. To encourage student's abilities to prosper in a world of change, collaboration, communication and critical thinking are promoted. Programs highlighting self-regulation, emotional intelligence, and responsible social interaction are coached through programs on campus such as: Boy's Town, Leadership Development Through Physical Education (LDTPE), Organization Nation, Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID), Robotics, Campus Climate Assistants (CCA) and lunch time interventions. Teachers meet monthly with Data Teams to analyze the achievement of their practice and outcomes of their students. The all-encompassing ability to be proficient in the skill of learning, literacy and life skills is the goal.
